I took these verses and like a girl with her first boyfriend, I read these "love notes" over and over again. Two changes happened: verses like these showed up often

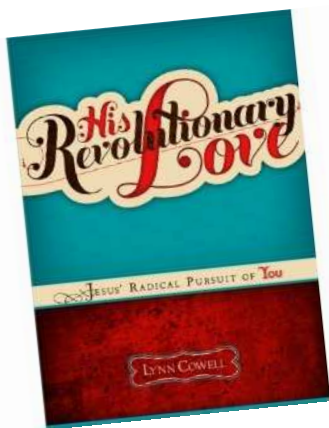

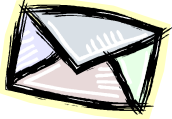

Tears began to swell in my eyes because I knew I had hurt Mr. Brunn. And Mr. Brunn really was an incredible teacher. I tried to apologize but the words, *I'm sorry*, just didn't feel adequate in those moments. I felt horrible. Mr. Brunn taught me a very valuable lesson that day.

Our culture tells us that its cool to be cynical. The little cuts we give each other are supposed to be funny. And having a witty tongue is apparently a good quality.

But according to God's Word, we are supposed to honor the people in our lives. And that day, I took the honor away from Mr. Brunn --all for the sake of trying to fit in. From that day on, I understood the power that my tongue held. While I still make mistakes, I am trying harder each day to show honor to people above me,

beside me and below me.

Because when we are devoted to the gospel of Jesus, we are devoted to love and love is devoted to honor.

Nicki's tips for showing honor:

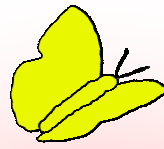
